

Rules on Undergraduate Degrees with Dual Program Designations

(An excerpt from Senate paper SN33/15/97)

- Only a single degree is awarded, distinguished by a program designation (e.g. BBA in Finance and Marketing).
- The number of program designations is limited to two.
- The student fully satisfies the program requirements of both program designations and both programs approve awarding the dual designations.
- The student completes the program within the normal period of study, i.e. three years for students admitted without advanced standing. (If approval has been granted to extend the period of study for reasons unrelated to pursuit of the dual program designation, this restriction would apply to the extended period.)
- Provided that the School can certify a student's study for dual program designations, the Dean may approve on an individual basis the student's application for extending his/her period of study by one session immediately following the last semester in the normal period of study. Further extension into the semester following that session is not allowed.
- In determining the class of honors of a degree with dual program designation, the requirements of both programs will be given full weight; for example, by including in the calculation of the graduation grade average (GGA) the grades in all courses required by either program. Surplus courses may be excluded from the GGA only by agreement of both programs, and the class of honors to be awarded must be jointly recommended.
